<p>2. Why do you think Shannon asks, “Why would you send a ‘selfie’?”</p>	<p>a. There’s nothing wrong with sending a ‘selfie’, she is too cautious.</p>	<p>b. Shannon doesn’t know if Megan can trust Chris.</p>	<p>c. Chris wasn’t being nasty, Shannon is no fun.</p>
<p>3. Megan could ask her Mum for advice. Instead she tells her to get out of her room. What’s going on?</p>	<p>a. Megan doesn’t need advice, it’s easy to make the right decision in a situation like this.</p>	<p>b. This is a missed opportunity, her Mum might have some ideas that Megan hasn’t thought about.</p>	<p>c. Megan thinks her Mum won’t understand.</p>
<p>4. Chris’s mate, Jamie, says, “Ask her to send a selfie, if she likes you she’ll send one”. Is he behaving like a good friend?</p>	<p>a. Its only a text, it doesn’t matter what he says.</p>	<p>b. Yes, girls should always send pictures whenever boys ask.</p>	<p>c. He is putting Chris under pressure, though he may not have thought about that.</p>
